


Book Talk:

THE ACTION BIBLE

Written and edited by Doug Mauss, illustrated by Sergio Cariello for David C. Cook publishers, 2010.

This colourful, attention-grabbing retelling of the Bible in comic form is geared to children 8-12 years of age. But it could be argued that this would be a valuable resource for the young-at-heart of any age! We are considering purchasing our own copy in order to better engage with our grandson, Cohen, who has read the whole book cover to cover. He is fascinated with the dramatic, fast-paced narratives and "very cool" illustrations. In addition to gaining Biblical knowledge, this resource is also helpful in developing children's reading skills.



The illustrator is Brazilian-born Sergio Cariello, who is also the Marvel and DC comics' graphic artist. You can see

from the cover that his designs are bold in their depiction of the emotion and significance of the figures of the Bible. It is easy to follow the historical flow as the stories are written in chronological order.

We are having great fun creating skill-testing questions for our grandson about the characters and plot-lines in his Bible. The graphic novel concept is brilliant for preteens in this regard. There are also devotionals and accompanying products available to augment their learning.


Once we are back into our church building, we will be sure to have a copy of this Bible available in our St. Paul's resource library for your perusal.
